



Monday 4<sup>th</sup> January 2021

Dear Nursery Parents and Carers,

We hope that this finds you safe and well and that, despite the circumstances, you all managed to find time to rest over the holiday period.

In light of the government announcement on 30<sup>th</sup> December, the children at Grove Park Primary School will be learning from home at the start of the Spring term. A return to school for face-to-face teaching will be reviewed by the government over the next couple of weeks.

While we know that this is a very difficult situation for children, parents and staff, the decision to move to remote learning has been made by the government as part of the Tier 4 'Stay at Home' guidance. The children and staff are being directed to learn and teach from home due to the particularly high infection rates of COVID-19 in London and to protect our community and the NHS at this critical time.

This letter aims to address any questions and queries you may have about the start of the Spring term.

**When will the children be able to return to face-to-face teaching in the school building?**

At present, the only information we have been given is that a review will take place over the next two weeks to decide whether the children can come back into school on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> January. We do not yet know when this review will be. The Department for Education has reassured us that the priority is for children to be in school with their teachers and peers, but that this has to be in-line with transmission rates of COVID-19 and an assessment of the pressure on the NHS.

**My child is asking lots of questions about why school is closed, will any information be given to the children directly?**

We know that not being able to come into the school building may be confusing for young children. **I have heard that some children can come into school? This would be better for my child; please can they join this group?**

Due to the very high transmission rates of COVID-19 at present, it is safer for children to be at home. According to specific criteria, some children will be accessing remote learning in school primarily to support those parents who are Critical Workers. The children who come into the building will be taking part in exactly **the same remote learning as the children who remain at home**. The children in school will be working independently on a device (e.g. a Chrome Book) on which they will be able to access the live lessons and Google Classroom under the supervision of support staff. This will ensure all children have the same equal access to and experience of the curriculum.

### **When will remote learning begin?**

Monday 4<sup>th</sup> January was always an INSET Day and so the Spring term at Grove Park begins on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> January.

### **How will I know what my child has to do at home?**

On Monday 4<sup>th</sup> January you will receive a Parentmail from Miss Diskin, it will include the activities for Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> - Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January. The Parentmail will include the Zoom links and times.

### **How much remote learning will there be each day? What happens if the teacher is unwell?**

There will be two live Zooms with Miss Diskin each day and in addition to this there will be independent activities for the children to complete – these will all be sent in the Parentmail on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> after 4pm. There will be an equivalent amount of adult-directed activities as there would be during a morning in Nursery, but it is also important for your child to continue to play imaginatively and creatively with their toys at home. Your child can work at times that are convenient for your family.

There will be a Zoom at the start of the day to explain the learning and activities for the day ahead and then a Zoom later in the morning to finish off the morning, say goodbye and perhaps share a story.

If the Class Teacher is unwell, members of the Senior Leadership Team will lead the live sessions.

There will be a range of learning areas covered throughout the week, ensuring the children continue to have access to a broad and balanced curriculum while they are at home. There will also be one music lesson per week too – links for these will also be sent via Parentmail.

### **Does my child have to wear uniform for live sessions?**

Please ensure the children are dressed appropriately for live sessions (e.g. not in nightwear). They do not have to be in school uniform, but you may find that if the children wear their school jumper when they are working they will feel more 'ready' to engage in school work.

Please try to avoid the children joining the live sessions in their bedrooms.

### **What will happen if my child is not able to join one or both of the live Zoom sessions?**

We know that the times of live sessions may not suit all families (e.g. a device may not be available) and that some children find live sessions overwhelming. Therefore, all live sessions will be recorded and the link will be sent home via Parentmail as soon as possible.

### **I understand that the live teaching sessions will be recorded, how will this affect my child's personal data?**

The recordings of the live teaching sessions (not class Zooms on Fridays) will be shared on Google classroom. Please ensure your child's video is off if you do not want their image to be on the recording. It is also best to only put your child's first name as their screen name on Zoom.

## Does my child have to complete the remote learning?

Whilst we know that each family will have different pressures and circumstances, the expectation is that the children will engage with as much of the remote learning as possible. We are aware that some children will not be able to come to all of the live sessions and may need to watch the recordings at another time during the day. Therefore, the way in which we will be keeping track of the children's participation in the learning will be by viewing their completed and submitted work in the Class e-mail box. If the staff notice that a child is not completing or submitting work we will make contact by phone to see how we can support.
